

# ABOUT THE PROJECT

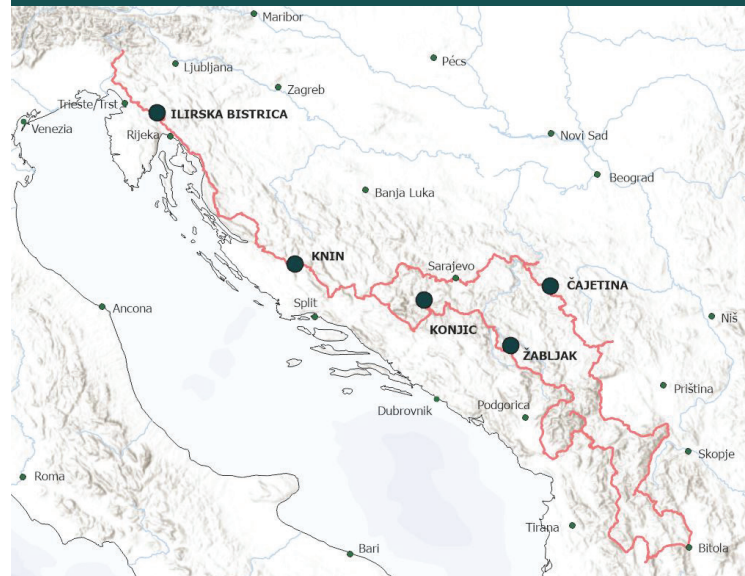


TRANSDINARICA2 builds on the Trans Dinarica cycling route, a 3,364 km trail stretching from Slovenia to North Macedonia through the heart of the Danube and Dinaric region.

The long distance cycling route connects rural landscapes, remote villages, national parks, UNESCO sites and promote sustainable exploration of one of Europe's most diverse yet underdeveloped areas. Although internationally recognized by Lonely Planet and National Geographic, Trans Dinarica currently exists mainly as a digital map. TRANSDINARICA2 aims to transform this long distance cycling route into a tangible driver of local development by strengthening tourism quality, accessibility, and community involvement, while connecting Trans Dinarica to the Alpe Adria cycling route.

# WHAT ARE TRANS DINARICA HUBS?

Trans dinarica HUBS are local centres established along the Trans Dinarica route to support communities and sustainable tourism development. These small yet powerful spaces act as the hearts of rural activation. They serve as information points for travellers and local residents, community gathering places for dialogue, cooperation, and programme venues for initiatives such as Skills on Wheels, workshops, exhibitions, and cultural events. The HUBS also function as spaces for innovation in sustainable tourism, green mobility, and inclusive participation. While each HUB reflects its local context, all share a common mission: to empower communities, connect people, and bring the Trans Dinarica vision to life. They can be seen as the living rooms of the route, open, welcoming and full of potential.
